In 2013, Baird converted her 1997 doctoral thesis into *Revolution from Within*, a narrative nonfiction to be released for publication in the fall of 2014. A series of related books and articles are also planned.

Baird also began a company called "From Pyramids to Clouds," a place for discussion and discovering connections as people embrace unity and consciousness: a growing, international movement that encourages people to look within themselves, follow their passions and live in harmony, treating one another in a supportive and sustainable way. "A pyramid symbolizes the old top-down, hierarchical system in which the goal of life seems to be trying to climb to the top. Clouds evoke global, free associations of self-contained individuals in local communities and shared interest groups," Baird notes. She is thrilled to be building the infrastructure and capabilities needed for this ambitious project.

As time permits, Baird leads classes as an Adjunct Professor in the Computer Information Systems department of the Robinson College of Business at Georgia State University, and participates on the advisory boards of several start-up and local businesses. She is an active member of the Technology Association of Georgia, GlobalEXECWomen, Georgia CXO Forum, Managed Service Professional Alliance and the CIO Forum.
